No laws regulating Commercial Surrogacy

- No protections for mothers and babies from the Surrogacy Industry Alabama, Colorado, Georgia, Hawaii, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, 21 Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Vermont, Wisconsin
- Green Light—Laws that allow Commercial Surrogacy with Restrictions Very little protections for mothers and babies from the Surrogacy Industry Arkansas, Florida, Illinois, North Dakota, Texas, Utah, West Virginia
- Green Light—Commercial Surrogacy Friendly Laws Very little protections for mothers and babies from the Surrogacy Industry California, Connecticut, Delaware, Maine, Nevada, New Hampshire, Washington

South Dakota has no regulations or protections related to surrogacy. The surrogacy industry considers states like South Dakota "open for business" and preys on women who may have no understanding of the legal rights they are surrendering or the health risks they could face when entering into a surrogacy contract.
